2 SUBMITTALS

- .1 Make submittals according to the Conditions of the Contract and the applicable Division 01 Specification Sections.
- .2 Submit a site-specific Health and Safety Plan within 7 days after the date of the Notice to Proceed and prior to commencement of the Work. The Health and Safety Plan must include, at a minimum:
 - .1 Results of a site-specific safety hazard assessment.
 - .2 Results of a safety and health risk or hazard analysis for site tasks and operation found in the work plan.
- .3 Submit 2 copies of the Contractor's authorized representative's work site health and safety inspection reports to the Consultant and the authority having jurisdiction, weekly.
- .4 Submit copies of reports or directions issued by Provincial health and safety inspectors.
- .5 Submit copies of incident and accident reports.
- .6 Submit WHMIS MSDS - Material Safety Data Sheets for products used in the Work.
- .7 The Consultant will review the Contractor's site-specific Health and Safety Plan and provide comments to the Contractor within 10 days after receipt of the plan. Revise the plan as appropriate and resubmit the plan to the Consultant within 5 days after receipt of comments from the Consultant.
- .8 The Consultant's review of the Contractor's final Health and Safety plan should not be construed as approval and does not reduce the Contractor's overall responsibility for construction Health and Safety.
- .9 Include an On-Site Contingency and Emergency Response Plan. Address standard operating procedures to be implemented during emergency situations.

3 FILING OF NOTICE

- .1 File Notice of the Project with Provincial authorities prior to beginning of Work.

4 SAFETY ASSESSMENT

- .1 Perform a site-specific safety hazard assessment related to the Project.

5 MEETINGS

- .1 Schedule and administer a Health and Safety meeting with the Consultant prior to commencement of Work.

6 GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- .1 Develop a written site-specific Health and Safety Plan based on a hazard assessment prior to beginning site Work and continue to implement, maintain, and enforce the plan until final demobilization from the site. The Health and Safety Plan must address the project specifications.
- .2 The Consultant may respond in writing, where deficiencies or concerns are noted and may request re-submission with correction of deficiencies or concerns.

7 RESPONSIBILITY

- .1 Be responsible for the health and safety of persons on site, the safety of property on site and for protection of persons adjacent to the site and the environment to the extent that they may be affected by conduct of the Work.
- .2 Comply with and enforce compliance by employees with the safety requirements of the Contract Documents, applicable federal, provincial, territorial and local statutes, regulations, and ordinances, and with the site-specific Health and Safety Plan.

8 UNFORSEEN HAZARDS

- .1 When unforeseen or peculiar safety-related factors, hazards, or conditions occur during the performance of the Work, follow the procedures in place for Employee's Right to Refuse Work in accordance with Acts and Regulations of the Province of Ontario and advise the Consultant verbally and in writing.

9 HEALTH AND SAFETY COORDINATOR

- .1 Employ and assign to the Work, a competent and authorized representative as Health and Safety Coordinator. The Health and Safety Coordinator must:
 - .1 Have site-related working experience specific to the activities associated with this Project.
 - .2 Have a working knowledge of the occupational safety and health regulations.
 - .3 Be responsible for completing the Contractor's Health and Safety Training Sessions and ensuring that personnel not successfully completing the required training are not permitted to enter the site to perform Work.
 - .4 Be responsible for implementing, enforcing daily and monitoring the site-specific Contractor's Health and Safety Plan.
 - .5 Be on site during the execution of the Work.

10 POSTING OF DOCUMENTS

- .1 Ensure applicable items, articles, notices and orders are posted in a conspicuous location on site in

accordance with the Acts and Regulations of the Province of Ontario and in consultation with the Consultant.

11 CORRECTION OF NON-COMPLIANCE

- .1 Give precedence to the safety and health of the public and site personnel and protection of the environment over cost and schedule considerations for the Work.
- .2 Immediately address health and safety non-compliance issues identified by the authority having jurisdiction or by the Consultant.
- .3 Provide the Consultant with a written report of action taken to correct non-compliance of health and safety issues identified.
- .4 The Consultant may stop Work if non-compliance of health and safety regulations is not corrected.

12 BLASTING

- .1 Blasting or other use of explosives is not permitted without the prior receipt of written instruction by the Consultant.

13 POWDER ACTUATED DEVICES

- .1 Use powder actuated devices only after receipt of written permission from the Consultant.
